Sr. Mary Aquinas Judge, SSF

Sister Mary Aquinas Judge (nee Blanche Odette Judge), daughter of the late Joseph Vincent Judge and Ethel Carmon Judge entered into eternal rest on January 11, 2012. Sister Aquinas was born in Palmetto, Louisiana on October 11, 1915 and was 96 years old. She entered the Congregation of the Sisters of the Holy Family on September 8, 1933, professed Temporary Vows on May 30, 1936 and made Perpetual Profession on August 15, 1942.

During her seventy-eight years in religious life, Sister ministered to the people of God as a teacher and catechist in the following schools and parishes: St. Francis Xavier, Breaux Bridge, Louisiana; St. Paul and Immaculate Heart of Mary, Lafayette, Louisiana; Holy Ghost, Opelousas, Louisiana; Holy Rosary, Galveston, Texas; Holy Redeemer, San Antonia, Texas; Our Mother of Mercy, Houston, Texas; and St. Joseph, Marshall, Texas. Sister also served as Novice Mistress for six years. Prior to Hurricane Katrina, Sister Aquinas served in the Prayer Ministry at the Motherhouse. After Hurricane Katrina, she lived in Alexandria, Louisiana and stayed there until 2011 when she returned to the Motherhouse in New Orleans, Louisiana. Her last few months at the Motherhouse were memorable ones. She delighted in time spent with old Novitiate friends, and often expressed her gratitude to the Sisters for bringing her back to live at the Motherhouse. Her short stay at the Motherhouse left a lasting and edifying image to those who ministered to her. Sister Laura Mercier said, "I found Sister Aquinas joyful, alert, and very grateful for the care given to her. Everyday she remarked how happy she was to be at the Motherhouse. It was evident that Sister deeply loved her family. I thank God for permitting me to be there for her."

Sister Aquinas was preceded in death by her parents, John and Ethel Judge and her sister, Mary. She is survived by devoted cousins and friends. She will be greatly missed by all. Sr. Mary Aguinas Judge Memorial Hund
